It's in the Rule Book!

The question of when to sweep and who can sweep stones came up during league play recently. Here's what the rule book states....

1. Between the tee lines, all members of the delivering team may sweep/brush any of their team's stones that have been delivered or set in motion.
2. Only the skip or vice-skip of the non-delivering team may sweep/brush their team's stone(s) after it is set in motion.
3. Behind the tee line, only one player from each team may sweep/brush at one time. This may be the skip or vice-skip of either team or the lead or second of the delivering team.
4. Behind the tee line, the delivering team shall have first privilege of sweeping/brushing any stone. If their choice is not to sweep/brush, they shall not obstruct or prevent the non-delivering skip or vice skip from sweeping/brushing the stone.
5. An opponent's delivered stone or stone set in motion shall not be swept/brushed until it reaches the farther tee line and sweeping/brushing shall only take place behind the tee line.
